INTRODUCTION



The Destination Study is an annual survey sent to the advisory teachers of the graduating cohort of Big Picture students in Term 4 to:


- · gain an overview of the cohort's demography
- track student post-school destinations
- see if there are links between a student's destination and their interests, internships, and their Senior Project

This information is invaluable in providing insight into the engagement, inclusion and transition of our students. It is anonymised before it is used in reporting to the BPLA Board, key stakeholders (including State Departments of Education) and our national network of schools.

This Destination Study was completed for 317 out of 331 students. This is our highest completion rate to date. So far, 182 students have confirmed their post-school destinations.

Student demographic information

- 9 EALD students (2.8%)
- 32 ATSI students (10%)
- 124 students with a confirmed disability diagnosis (39.11%)



THE SENIOR PROJECT/SENIOR THESIS

As part of their work in Years 11 and 12, students develop a Senior Project or Senior Thesis. This is typically completed with the support of a mentor. In 2023, 261 students (82.3%) completed a Senior Project or Thesis.

The Senior Project

This a long-term project where the student works towards creating a product in their interest area. Senior Projects include:

- Articulating movement in animation
- Baking dog treats and how they can be used to treat illnesses
- Creating a fitness program for people who have additional needs and disabilities
- Connecting to Eritrean Culture through food
- Dungeons and Dragons as a form of applied therapy
- Game development portfolio
- Literature and Community Book Club organisation
- Music production (created an album)
- Sensory Play in Preschool
- Starting a car-flipping business
- Starting a photography and videography business
- Universe creation fictional world-building with character profiling
- Using E-Waste to refurbish computers to reduce landfill.




The Senior Thesis

Typically, students on a university pathway work on a Senior Thesis which explores a driving question about a chosen topic. This involves significant research. Senior Thesis topics include:

- Designing and developing an online basketball simulation game called Basketball Manager
- A Comparative Analysis of Percutaneous Coronary Intervention (PCI) versus Coronary Artery Bypass Grafting (CABG) on Patient Outcomes
- A Quantitative Study into Individuals' Primary Energy Usage and Reduction
- Can kitchen and garden-based intervention programs improve the consumption and knowledge of fruit and vegetables in adolescents?
- Diet Diversity in Adolescent Athletes
- Does the perception of beauty that we form as adolescents fundamentally become the way we perceive beauty as adults?
- How can we embed Aboriginal Pedagogy into the classroom by using culturally appropriate frameworks?
- How do geographical location, social isolation and technology impact victim's coping abilities when experiencing domestic violence?
- Is de-extinction viable?
- Is negative or positive reinforcement the preferred method when it comes to dog training?
- Mental Health issues in Teenagers: Comparing Diagnosis Rates and Environmental Contributions then vs now
- The Application of Diverse Sensory Experiences
 to Building Design
- The connection between dark matter and the black hole creation

LEARNING WITH MENTORS




Graph 1: The fields and domains of mentors who have connected with students in 2023

A key feature of the Big Picture Learning Design is connecting students with adult mentors in their interest area. Mentors can offer support in student learning by guiding project work, sharing insight into what it is like to work in their profession, trade or art, and creating outlearning opportunities. They also provide ready access to the latest in thinking, technology and practice. In 2023, 219 students (69%) connected with a mentor during their senior years. 35 students (11%) had more than 1 mentor.

Internships


A key distinguisher of the Design is learning through internships. Students are encouraged to spend 40% of their time learning out of the classroom in a real-world work environment linked to their interest(s). In 2023, 191 students (60.2%) had a significant (5+ days) internship. Destinations include:

- 1 day a week for 20 weeks at Vinnies
- 1 day a week at a care facility, intermittently throughout senior school
- Daily work at the local vet
- · Weekly at Tender Funerals
- 10 weeks at Ngaarda Media
- 3 terms at Central Coast Zoo
- · 3 terms at Coastal Cardiology Clinic
- · 3 terms coaching at Central Coast Mariners
- · 3 terms at Fabric Architecture Studio
- 3 terms at Impact Gym
- 1 year School-based apprenticeship in hairdressing
- 1 year at St Jude's Primary School developing and running a music/dance program
- 1 year at the NRL Coaching Program
- 1 year at Creative Childcare
- 18 months at Urban Doggo Dog Grooming
- 2 years at NSW Youth Parliament.





QUALIFICATIONS




Graph 2: The types of TAFE qualifications attained by students in 2023

Students can complete courses and obtain qualifications as part of their learning in their fields of interest. These might be obtained through external courses, or by undertaking subjects within mainstream school. Typically, such outlearning is connected to a student's post-school plans. In 2023, 124 students (39.1%) achieved a TAFE qualification related to their interest. 14 students (4.4%) received more than 1 TAFE qualification.

222 students (70%) completed other outlearning related to their interest. 100 students (31.5%) completed more than one.




